The institution is affiliated to University of Mysore (UOM), Mysuru. The academic curriculum is designed by Board of Studies (BOS) of the concerned Dept. of Studies of UOM, Mysore. Each BOS designed syllabus, teaching hours & panel of examiners. The Board of Appointment of Examiners (BOAE) constituted a separate BOE for each subject for a period of three years. This will act to organise Question paper preparation, scrutiny, conducting practical examination and evaluation.. In each Undergraduate programme, students are studying three optional, two languages & three compulsory papers in NON-CBCS & CBCS semester system. University will provides the exam time table; Accordingly our institute will conduct the examinations. All eight Postgraduate programmes have also adopted the academic curriculum of UOM. College Adopted CBCS with semester (4-semesters) system. In this system, student will study soft and hard Core & open elective papers. In addition to these, each student is engaged in delivering the seminar& project / dissertation work. The evaluation is carried for both UG and PG in three stages namely C1 & C2 as internal examination and C3 as semester end examination.

Feedback Obtained

Students about faculty: The feedback obtained was noticed that more number of students pointed about lack of communication skills among faculty. To overcome this point, management have been organizing regular faculty development programmes. Students about institution: The feedback obtained was noticed that more number of students pointed and demanded more number of recently published text books and ICT facilities. To resolve these, IQAC has discussed the matter with principal and management to purchase books and provide more number of ICT Rooms. Teacher about institution: Many of our teachers have suggested to minimize the non-academic work and requested the much more academic infrastructure. VERMI COMPOSTING: The Zoology department has been guided their students regarding preparation of vermi composte in the garden of Bharthi Nagara campus Vermi composting, or worm composting, turns kitchen scraps and other green waste into a rich, dark soil that smells like earth and feels like magic. Made of almost pure worm castings, it's a sort of super compost. Not only is it rich in nutrients but it's also loaded with the microorganisms that create and maintain healthy soil provides nutrients to the soil. increases the soil's ability to hold nutrients in a plant-available form improves the soil structure, improves the aeration and internal drainage of heavy clay soils, increases the water holding ability of sandy soils, provides numerous beneficial bacteria. "Vermicompost products have many applications, including home gardening, landscaping, turfgrass, golf courses, viticulture, DOT projects, use in potting soil for the horticultural industry. 2.ANALYSIS OF WATER QUALITY The institute conducted water quality analysis in three villages namely Yalada ally, Bidarahosahally and Nelamakana Hally.
